


RESOLUTION NO. 2021-282

WHEREAS, the City has prepared the report.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Phenix City, Alabama, accepts the Annual Transportation Report as submitted.

RE: Annual Transportation Plan Report

On March 12, 2019, the Alabama Legislature passed House Bill 2 which levied an additional excise tax on gasoline and diesel fuel (10 Cent Gas tax). This additional tax is to be used for maintenance, improvement, replacement and construction of roads and bridges that are maintained by the City. The Bill further stipulates that the City Engineer shall provide a written report detailing expenditures made from these monies during the previous year and include the status of the projects shown in the Annual Transportation Plan.

It is estimated that the City will receive \$328,904.77 from the additional ten (10) Cent Gas Tax in FY 2021/22. The City, through funding from the C-PC Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), plans to resurface 4th Place from Knowles Road to Seale Road, Knowles Road from 16th Avenue to 4th Place, 43rd Street from Summerville Road to the end and Replace the Bridge over Cochagalechee Creek on Seale Road. By utilizing MPO funds for these projects, the City must provide a 20% match in funding for these projects for Preliminary Engineering and Construction activities. The total cost to the City for Preliminary Engineering and Construction for all four of these projects is \$422,005.55 which will include \$328,904.77 of FY 2021/22 Ten (10) Cent Gas Tax funds. The balance of funding needed will come from the Capital funds budget. The attached resolution states this information and is considered the Transportation Plan that must be approved.
